Information you need to give to your attorney

Questions you should ask your attorney

● The level of conflict YOU expect in your case and how you want YOUR case handled.

● What you believe to be a fair resolution to the case (if known to you).

● What your budget is to complete your case.

● A truthful and accurate list of all marital assets and debts.

● A truthful and accurate accounting of your income.

● An other information your attorney may need to give you the best legal advice possible-including the bad stuff!

● Can they honor your desire for the level of conflict you want in your case, particularly if it is low conflict.

● Do they think your expectations for the case are realistic?

● Do they think they can complete your case within your budget?

● Will any other attorneys or paralegals be working on your case?

● Do they have experience handling cases like yours? If so, how do they normally end? (ex: trial, mediation, negotiation)

● Is there anything they recommend that you do to help you achieve your goals in your case?

Remember that just because you meet with an attorney, you are not obligated to hire them. Find an attorney that aligns with your personal goals, can work within your budget, and feels like a good fit for you.
